Ongoing Sexual Assaults in the Medical Center

This alert is provided to inform and to educate the campus community of reported activity that has happened on our campus or in our Medical Center area.

SAPD issued a warning after attacks on women in the Medical Center area. A series of attacks on women in the Medical Center has San Antonio police warning people who live in that area to stay on alert. Police spokesman, Sgt. Jesse Salame, confirmed Monday that an unknown number of attacks have taken place in recent weeks at apartment complexes in the general area of Huebner and Babcock roads. Police are urging people to be aware of their surroundings. "A lot of these reports are coming in for someone who was hanging around suspiciously in a parking lot," Salame said. "If you see somebody that looks like they're just up to no good, or maybe they don't seem like they're doing anything other than watching you, don't get out of your car." Salame said it's best to drive to another location and call 911. Police have only a vague description of the attacker at this time.



Personal Safety Tips:

Be aware of your surroundings.

Always lock your vehicle after entering or exiting your vehicle.

If practical immediately write down or memorize the description of the suspect and any other important information, such as; Hair color and style of hair, color of complexion, height, weight, and clothing description.

Never hesitate to contact the police department immediately by dialing 911, 210-567-2800, or 567-8911.

If you see something suspicious, remember that we are always available to our campus community 24 hours a day.

You are also encouraged to contact the Health Science Center Police Department and request an escort (Safety Walk) to your vehicle.
